- Keep all high value gold in a safe that is bolted to the floor or wall.
- Remove high value gold from the house when you are not around
- CCTV
- Do not advertise on social media any high valued jewelry or when you are not home
- Keep a log and receipts of what jewelry you have just in case you are a victim of crime
