Welcome to January newsletter


Happy New Year to you all.

Prevent Catalytic Converter Theft!

Use a 'Cage Clamp' that locks in around the converter to make it difficult to remove. Use a car 'Tilt Sensor' alarm








- Contact your vehicle dealership on fitting an aftermarket product approved by the vehicle manufacturer to prevent your converter being removed. The dealership can advise on the most suitable way to secure the converter, depending upon the make and model.
- A tilt sensor connected to the vehicle alarm system can activate if thieves attempt to jack the vehicle up in order to target the converter.

 Once again, speak to your vehicle dealership about a manufacturer approved product. Consider using a marking or etching system to identify your converter—if stolen this will make it harder for thieves to dispose of.



CATALYTIC CONVERTER CRIME PREVENTION



How can you help keep your car safe? Try to make sure your vehicle is parked in a garage overnight. If you have a commercial vehicle park it in a secure compound. If this isn't possible, park in an area that is well-lit and overlooked. Try to park so that the converter cannot be easily reached by potential thieves. Vehicles that sit high above the road are particularly vulnerable. Park in areas covered by CCTV where possible.

- What is a catalytic converter? A catalytic converter is part of a cars emissions control system. It is located close to the engine, it cleans up the exhaust gases before they are expelled from the car through the exhaust pipe. It has internal elements that react with the gases, breaking them down into less harmful substances and water vapour. All cars sold in Europe since 1993 have had to be fitted with catalytic converter by law.
- ➡ Why are they a target for thieves? Catalytic converters can be expensive to replace, but they are required to keep a car road-worthy. This means that as cars get older and their value decreases, the cost of a replacement unit might become prohibitive. We have found that complete catalytic converters have been stolen either to keep older cars on the road, or for their scrap value − they contain precious metals such as rhodium, platinum and palladium.
